To make friends – заводить друзей

to keep in touch - не терять связь

to lose track of sb - потерять кого-то

to get on well with sb - ладить с кем-то

to have a lot in common with sb – иметь много общего

to be/get used to (doing sth) - привыкнуть

to break a confidence – нарушить конфиденциальность

to be in on a secret – знать какой-то секрет

to stick with each other - держаться вместе

to give up on a friendship – перестать дружить («забить» на дружбу)

to reach out to people - тянуться к людям

to care about sb- волноваться о (не безразлично)

to neglect sth - пренебрегать чем-то

to argue/to fight with - спорить/ругаться

to be guilty - быть виноватым

fault - вина

(Ex: It's not my fault – я не виноват)

sociable- коммуникабельный, общительный

optimistic- оптимистичный

intolerant - нетерпимый; раздражительный

supportive – оказывающий поддержку

modest - скромный

considerate – внимательный к чувствам других

caring - заботливый

sensitive – чувственный

indifferent – безразличный

insightful - проницательный

conscientious - добросовестный, сознательный

down-to-earth - разумный, практичный

offensive - агрессивный, неприятный

tolerant - терпимый, толерантный

Idioms:

- to get on like a house on fire_ to have a good relationship, to get on really well, to read one another's mind
- **to be on the same page** If people are on the same page, they have the same information and are thinking the same way.
- to stick with each other to stick together, to be standing by, to be there to help one another out
- to grow apart to separate from one another gradually. (Over the years, they grew apart from each other. Ted and Sharon grew apart and saw less and less of each other)
- to grow together gradually become attached, united or close (We GREW TOGETHER while we were working on the same project.)
- to be finger and thumb to be best friends, to always stick together
- bosom / near / intimate / sworn friends / a sidekick the best friend ever
- bff best friend forever
- · to backdoor smb, to scheme against smb
- **on-off relationship** = where you're sometimes friendly, and sometimes not: "Cath and Liz have an on-off relationship."
- fair-weather friend = a friend who's never around when you need help: "She's only a fair-weather friend."
- **a frenemy** = someone who's a friend and an enemy at the same time.
- have friends in high places = know important / influential people: "Be careful what you say. He's got friends in high places."
- \circ a shoulder to cry on: someone who listens to your problems
 - It's always good to talk to Hilary, she's so sympathetic. She's a realshoulder to cry on
- o see eye to eye: to agree with someone
 - (usually used in the negative) They don't always see eye to eye on politics but they're still great friends
- o no love lost: disagree with someone
 - They used to be best friends but they had a huge fight about money. Now there's **no love lost** between them
- hate someone's guts: to very strongly dislike someone They fell out and now she hates his guts
